#### **Electronic Resources**

Basic format: Collect as much information as possible for your citations. Not all information will be provided or necessary, but, in general, use this basic format: author and/or editor names, title of work, name of electronic source (i.e. website), version numbers (volume, issue numbers, etc.), publisher/sponsor information (if not available, use n.p.), publication date (if not available use n.d.), and date of access. Journals that do not give page numbers use n. pag.

URL's are not required unless your instructor requires them, or the reader cannot locate the
source without it; give it immediately after the date of access (example:
